^{*}Estimated total cost to decommission San Onofre is \$4.4B; \$3.2B will be spent between 2013 and 2026 on the decommissioning project, which in turn will generate \$9B in output during that period. The remaining cost is for nuclear fuel management and site restoration, which is expected to continue through 2051.
