Scott Kibbey is currently serving as the South Sector Superintendent for Orange Coast District with California State Parks. He is the State's liaison between California State Parks and San Onofre Parks Foundation. The mission of California State Parks has guided him throughout his career as a Park Ranger, Supervisor, and in his current role as a Park Superintendent.

Superintendent Kibbey previously served California State Parks as a Park Ranger from 2007 to 2016 in Santa Cruz and Orange Coast Districts. He was promoted and served as a Park Supervisor from 2016 to 2021 at Crystal Cove State Park. In 2022, Scott was promoted to Orange Coast District- South Sector Superintendent. He received special recognition from Congressman Mike Levin for his efforts to secure a 3-year lease extension of San Onofre State Beach with the Department of Navy.

Scott is a US Coast Guard Veteran. He served in various missions across the Pacific from 1999 to 2003. He served in search and rescue operations, human and drug traffic enforcement, wildlife protection, and received special recognition from the United States Secretary of Transportation for protecting harbors and waterways during the attacks 9/11.

As an Orange County resident since 2009, Scott has been active in serving the community as a volunteer at local schools. He has also served as an Eagle Scout Mentor for Boy Scouts of America and has assisted dozens of scouts to earn the organization's highest award, Eagle Scout.
